


DEFINITE ARTICLE-'THE'

• 'The' is called as definite article as it indicates definite person, place or thing.

eg: *the* teacher, *the* park, *the* book, *the* America, *the* Nile river, *the* President





'THE' IS USED BEFORE A PARTICULAR PERSON

- *The* teacher is on leave today.
- Rachel went to meet *the* doctor yesterday.
- *The* gardener waters the plants.





'THE' IS USED BEFORE A PARTICULAR PLACE

- *The* hospital is near to my house.
- I bought my dress from *the* city.
- Alex is going to *the* playground.









'THE' IS USED BEFORE THINGS OF WHICH ONLY ONE EXISTS

- *The* sun rises in the east
- I saw *the* moon last night.
- *The* universe contains so many elements.





'THE' IS USED BEFORE ADJECTIVES OF SUPERLATIVE DEGREE

- Monica is *the* smartest girl in the class.
- Alex is *the* youngest kid in the family.
- George is *the* tallest boy in the team.





'THE' IS USED BEFORE THE NAMES OF RIVERS, MOUNTAINS, BUILDINGS ETC.

- *The* Nile
- *The* Everest
- *The* Burj Khalifa
